On the edge of Zeromskiego Park, you will find a playground for children. We have marked playgrounds on the map with the symbol:

FIND A CARVED OWL AND ROOSTER ON THE BUILDING OF THE MARITIME ACADEMY

Take a look at the two buildings of the Maritime Academy. The first of them has interesting devices on the roof. These are two sets of radar that allows you to learn how to navigate a real ship. Future ship officers study here. There is also a real planetarium in the Academy, which can be visited by making an appointment.

••<u>••••</u>•••• An interesting figure stands in the middle of the main terrace.

Above, at the entrance to the National Museum, you will see four carved medallions. One shows the pyramid and the Sphinx from Egyptian culture. The second is the Parthenon symbolizing Greek and Roman art, the third is the Gothic cathedral in Cologne, and the last depicts St. Peter's Cathedral in Rome. It is a symbolic representation of the ideas of the founders of the museum. They wanted to collect here examples of culture created by man from time immemorial. The museum tower offers a vast panorama, it is well worth climbing the stairs to its top.

Maritime Union. The academics sailing in those years could enter neither the Szczecin Bay nor the fairway of the Oder River due to the state border being right next door and this prohibited their entry because all of them were controlled by the Border Protection Forces. Such a world of adventures awaited the adventurous on the Dabskie Sea. However, amongst them all was someone truly unique - a cat named Umbriaga, who became somewhat legendary in the history of Szczecin sailing, for this was no ordinary cat; it was a sailor cat. Eventually it left the deck on the island of Debina to never return. Despite many searches, it was never found. Many are still convinced that its descendants live on this island to this day. Shanties are sung about Umbriaga, fairy tales are told, a yacht is also named after it, and an



ONCE UPON A TIME AT THE CASTLE

A long time ago, when Pomeranian dukes lived in the castle in Szczecin, the city was surrounded by a thick wall. Entry was only possible through the great gates that cut through the city walls like tunnels. One such gate was the Royal Gate.

Next to the gate, there is an antique lamp called the Zygmunt Lantern. Can you see swans on top of it holding balls with light bulbs in their beaks?

Time now to go to the Pomeranian Dukes' Castle! The castle belonged to the Griffin Dynasty, who

were once the rulers of the Duchy of Pomerania, who made Szczecin their capital. It is the only castle in the world where you can find an opera house. From Korsarzy Street, you are greeted by the princely couple - Bogusław X and Anna Jagiellonka, standing on a monument which commemorates the year of their wedding 1491 on an inscription on the plinth.

Look at the expansive lawn between the lanes of Castle Way. You will see a very old tree growing there. Such pecimens are called natural onuments. This ancient tree is over 300 years old and has its own name -Mateusz. Why? Read the legend.

The old church, visible from the square is named after Saints Peter and Paul. See the heads carved on the walls? These are the faces of the inhabitants of an earlier Szczecin! The legend of Sydonia von Borck is exhibited in the basement of the castle, known as the Witches' Cell.

Find a richly decorated clock in the large courtyard. On its face, you can see a princely jecter, Swedish lions, griffins, and the dates of it's renovation. The eyes on the great face on the hour-dial follow the hands as if keeping the clock from accelerating or decelerating. Look - in its open mouth, it has today's date, and above, there is a ball showing what the moon will look like tomorrow night. If you wait 15 minutes, the gongs on the clock will go off, hammered by the castle jester, Nicolaus. With his right hand, he will tap the smaller quarter



After visiting the castle, it is worth going down the hill to see the oldest parts of the city walls - the round Tower of Seven Coats, which is related to the legend of the dishonest tailor of Prince Bogusław X. Such towers and red brick walls surrounded the former Szczecin, sometimes called the Griffin Borough. We started our walk at the Royal Gate, which has survived to this day. We start our walk at Grunwaldzki Square, at the monument of a tall sailor, a Helmsman who bravely holds the helm of his ship with his collar raised by the wind, just as on the high seas. During the days of sea holidays, he is dressed in a sailor's shirt and trousers and in December in the outfit of St. Nicholas.

Imagine that the helm held by the sailor has the same number of arms as the number of streets departing from Grunwaldzki Square. Behind the sailor, there is Fontann Avenue, which is part of Jana Pawła II Avenue. This avenue is decorated with fountains between the cafes.

Entering the centre of Grunwaldzki Square, you can imagine you are flying high even into space, all the way to the stars! Three squares in Szczecin are shrouded in an urban cosmic legend established by astrologers.

Walking along the avenue, we pass beautifully decorated tenement houses. When we reach the intersection with Wielkopolska Street, let's turn off the main road for a moment and turn right. Γhis street leads to the Teatralny Square with the Pleciuga Puppet Theatre. You should try and see one of the performances where you can see

Due to its colour, the Szczecin City Hall building is referred to by many as the spinach palace. On its top, you can


